Maria Montessori said that 'going out', as she called it, is an important part of the 6 to 9 year old child's development, saying, "When the child goes out, it is the world itself that offers itself to him. Let us take the child out to show him real things instead of making objects which represent ideas and closing them in cupboards". These weekly walks will allow the children to connect with the local community, experience changes in the area and the seasons, as well as developing their large motor skills. All of the junior classes will be walking on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at 11:00. Please support your child to remember to bring shoes and a raincoat if necessary on those days.

From Leanna and Tauranga Montessori Education Trust (TMET)

Who and what is TMET? TMET are responsible for the governance of Montessori@Bellevue and Montessori@Arataki. In terms of the day to day running of individual classrooms, TMET has no involvement. This is the responsibility of the classroom teachers and ultimately, the responsibility of the school Principal.

TMET are responsible for: fiscal management of the funds (school fees); fostering relationships with the schools' Board Of Trustees and principals; supporting teachers with professional development, and to ensure both schools are running the very best Montessori programme possible. TMET also look after all enrolments for both schools, support the teaching teams with PIEs and PEEs, organise community events and maintain positive relationships with all our preschools. TMET also actively promote Montessori education in the Western Bay of Plenty, as per the charter.

I am a Trustee of TMET and I also hold the position of Executive Officer for the Trust. I am a Montessori teacher, pre and primary, and I owned a Montessori pre-school in Ireland before coming to New Zealand.

TMET is also comprised of Maia Ririnui, Tanya Drummond and Fenella Wilson. Lee Martin is not a Trustee, she organises all administration concerns.

If you have any concerns regarding your child, please direct them to your child's teacher in the first instance, and if you are not satisfied with the response please go to the Lead teacher and finally the School Principal.
