Like symbols, signs, and drawings, music is a universal language. Because of this there are huge benefits for children when they learn music and sing. All children, regardless of ability, circumstance, or cultural background, have a natural affinity for music (P. Vaiouli & A. Friesen, 2016). With 'Maui the Magnificent' fresh in our minds, many of us would have seen first hand how the enjoyment, engagement and inclusion of music impacted the children throughout the school. The show allowed children the opportunity to try something they might not ordinarily consider trying. Music provides learning opportunities throughout all areas of the curriculum. 'Just as spoken language is composed of a stream of connected phonemes, music comprises a series of sounds and musical notes or tones grouped together (Darrow et al., 2009). Therefore, many literacy skills are enhanced through music learning. For example, skills for reading - sounds, intonation for speech, and vocabulary is developed through song lyrics. Through music children also recognise patterns and repetition which is found throughout maths, sports, science, and literacy. Music and singing have wonderful benefits to children, such as; developing attention, focus, confidence, collaboration, memorisation, and risk taking. Plus, the added bonus is that when we sing or play music, endorphins are released in the brain. Whilst it can be nerve racking singing in front of others, hopefully, the feel good factor from the endorphins outweighs the nerves - it most definitely seemed to for many of our students during their performances at the beginning of the term! Amazing work was put in by all in their musical efforts!
