Dear Families

We would like to warmly welcome you to term three. We are assuming you have met the new teachers, if not please feel free to pop in and introduce yourself. TMET and Bellevue School are absolutely delighted to welcome Irene as team leader and Karina as a classroom teacher. As always we have a great knack of attracting teachers of high calibre who have a huge heart for Montessori education.

Montessori@Bellevue is constantly growing and evolving and we are incredibly proud to call ourselves the biggest Montessori primary in the country. We continue to have a close working relationship with all our feeding preschools and we are incredibly grateful for all their support around Parent Information Evenings, Education evenings and for being a key part in our wider community. We can speak for everyone at Montessori@Bellevue in saying we love having preschool teachers, parents and children come to visit us.

In terms of our teaching team, Irene is Montessori team leader and teaches in room 18 alongside Karina in room 19 and JayJay in room 20. They each work with their key groups of children and with the whole 6-9 cohort depending on what is happening on the day. In the 9-12 classrooms, Deirdre teaches in room 16 and Claire is in room 17. Our teachers bring with them a combined knowledge of 50+ years of teaching primary school children - jeepers that is a lot of children!!! We are fortunate that all our teachers believe there is another way to educate our tamariki, that being the Montessori way. This became apparent when the team attended the 3-day MANZ (Montessori Aotearoa New Zealand) conference in July and fully embraced the learning, returning inspired to implement this in our classrooms. The newer members of our team are committed to professional development and have been spending many hours reading up and learning as much as they can about the workings of a Montessori classroom. Our teachers already have a huge Montessori heart and TMET is supporting them with the day to day mechanics. JayJay and Deirdre already possess Montessori qualifications and the whole team will soon be engaging in external learning that, once completed, will give everyone a recognised qualification in Montessori 6-12 years.

All of our children have the opportunity to work with Rhiarne doing a huge variety of practical life activities such as cooking, community service, gardening, woodwork, planning tramps and event organisation, to name a few. We are so fortunate to have Steph who teaches in room 16 on Fridays and relieves in all classrooms when needed. When Steph is not teaching, she loves to do practical life with the children and they work on sewing projects, etc.

All of our teachers are supported by Bellevue School senior management and by Leanna Mitchell who supports them in the areas of professional learning around the Montessori specifics.
